- E.g. Desalinization, waste water treatment, etc



# Budapest Water Summit Youth Forum 8-11

## **Five Themes of Youth Forum**

- **1** Universal access to water and sanitation
- 2 Integrated water resources management for the 21st century
- **3** Good water governance
- 4 Green economy for blue water
- 5 Investment in and financing of the implementation of a water and sanitation

## Universal Access to Water and Sanitation

- **Recommended Actions:**
- <u>Prioritize access</u> for children, youth and the vulnerable.
- Encourage youth-led innovations in the WASH sector.
- Use of locally sourced materials and knowledge.
- <u>Alternative pricing</u> structures (e.g. progressive block tariffs).

## **Good Water Governance**

**Recommended Actions:** 

- <u>Inclusion</u> of youth at international and national high level decision-making processes.
- <u>Financial support</u> for youth-led initiatives by providing scholarships, internships, etc.
- <u>Permanent desk</u> for youth representatives in high level meetings and decision-making bodies.

## Investment in and Financing of the Implementation of a Water and Sanitation

**Recommended Actions** 

- <u>Fair, equitable and sustainable cost recovery</u> strategies for a sustainable financing of WASH.
- Enabling <u>youth entrepreneurship</u> and develop service based sanitation facility.
- Effective and <u>diversified support</u>, <u>credit and financial</u> <u>systems</u> that are easily accessible and affordable.
